2025 Officer Openings & Nominations

It is that time of year again as we are looking for our 2025 Officers. This is a great opportunity to help the club and advance the hobby. During the short meeting before the auction on November 16th, Ralph Buckwalter, nomination chairman, will ask members to stand for nomination for the following positions: Skipper, First Mate, Purser, and Clerk. The election will occur at the meeting on December 21st. Here are the responsibilities for each post as defined in our by-laws:

President/Skipper

• The President/Skipper shall have general supervision of the Club and its functions, preside over meetings of the club and the Board of Directors, call any special meetings, and appoint committees as required herein or as deemed appropriate, including appointment of an editor of the monthly newsletter ("Scuttlebutt").

Vice President/First Mate

• The Vice President/First Mate shall preside over the meetings in the Skipper's absence and shall organize a program for the regular meetings of the Club. If possible, program topics are to be announced in advance in the newsletter.

Treasurer/Purser

• The Treasure/Purser shall maintain the membership list of the Club, shall receive, and disburse the Club's funds as authorized and shall maintain a bank account for such purpose, as well as the financial records of the Club. He/she shall report periodically to the membership on the balance of any bank account. In addition, once yearly, an audit of the accounts will be conducted in concert with competent and responsible club members. To reserve/protect our sole usage of the Rocky Mountain Shipwrights Club name the Purser shall renew the registration/certification with the Colorado Secretary of State every two years.

Secretary/Ship's Clerk

• The Secretary/Ship's Clerk shall maintain any official records of the Club including minutes of the monthly Club meetings.

Auction

Our auction will be on November 16th, following a very abbreviated meeting.

We have a number of great items (see below) but are still looking for more. I am sure there are a lot you whose eyes have been bigger than your available time and you have some great stuff that you would like to get rid of.

Seller pre-registration

Each item/lot you wish to auction off must be accompanied by a Lot Description Form. These forms are being distributed along with the November Scuttlebutt mailing. Up to three items can be registered on a single page. Fill in your name and item description for each lot. A lot may be a "bundle" of items (three books for instance) or a single item. For sheets with multiple items, it is best to print out the sheet and then cut the page into three separate forms. Fill in the lot description for each lot. Bring the

completed forms along with the items to the auction between 9:00am and 9:30 on November 16. **NOTE**: there will be blank forms available if you have last-minute items to sell.

Lot Registration Process

Upon arriving at Rockler, find the check-in table. There each lot will be assigned a Lot Number that will be recorded on the Lot Description Form. If you wish to place a reserve on a lot, (i.e., designate the lot must be sold for more than the designated reserve amount.) tell the in-take person who will record the amount on a reserve list for the auctioneer. Once registered, the lots and their forms will be placed on the review tables for potential bidders to review.

Bidder participation

At the bidder participation table, potential bidders will be assigned a unique numbered bidding paddle to be used to indicate you are bidding on the current lot. Raise the paddle to participate at the current auctioneer's call; lower the paddle if you no longer wish to participate. You may re-enter the bidding again by raising the paddle. If a lot has a reserve designation and the bidding has not reached that reserve, the auctioneer may ask

the lot owner if they wish to cancel the reserve and accept the last bid. Once a winner is declared that person will take possession of the lot. The accompanying Lot Description Form will be updated with the winner's paddle number and the purchase amount. The purser will use the information to consolidate all purchases into statements for each winner. Those statements will be distributed at the December meeting/Christmas party. Any winners not attending will receive their statement by email.

Non-member participation

Any non-member who participates and wins a lot must pay for their purchase in cash or by check at the meeting.

As for a sneak peak of some of the things we have available, we have a really nice set of power tools from Festool (donated to the club by Harry Hamil's widow Susan) as well as equipment from a few other manufacturers. Many of these tools may not be ideal for model ships, they are excellent wood working tools. Hopefully, we will be able to share the minimum bids for these items in the Scuttlebutt.

Model Ship Builder

This website has a popular forum with over 1900 members and an extensive group of building logs. They also sponsor group builds and provide an opportunity for members to place articles. In addition, archived issues of "Warships and Workboats" and "MSB Journal' can be accessed here.

Model Ship World

This large comprehensive site is now operated by the Nautical Research Guild. It is a major forum with build logs and plenty of responses to modeler's questions. Also access shop notes, tips, techniques, and research.

John's Nautical & Boatbuilding Page

This site includes mostly life-size boat building material, but its self-proclaimed "Mother of All Maritime Links" can be helpful.

Bottled Ship Builder

This is a forum that is all about ships in bottles and miniature buildings. There is a lot of information on the site for anyone interested in ships in bottles and miniatures.

Model Ship Building Secrets

This is an English blog with a directory, "50 of the Best Model Ship Building Sites".

DeAgostini Model Space

A British commercial site selling kits and tools with a forum filled with build logs of large models.
